

FRENCH and SPANISH
The after-school program.

Give your child the gift of an adventure in a world language. In an after-school, once-a-week program, taught by Mrs. Redd, students will develop vocabulary & cultural content following themes such as Nature, the zoo & animals; food & eating traditions; weather & clothing; parts of the human body, the calendar & numbers; Christmas, Easter, & other holiday traditions. Better yet, parents may accompany their children at no cost!

If paid by **noon Thursday 31 August 2017**, the cost is \$75 for one semester. Or, until **noon 11 September 2017**, the fee is \$80. Classes start the week of **11 September 2017**.

With occasional non-school days & early dismissals, a minimum of ten hour-long sessions will be taught, ending 19 January 2018.

While this is a hands-on, active class, student expectations require a focus on the language.

We meet in the hallway at the door to the ICRS cafeteria at **3 pm**, then we walk together to the ICRS library for an hour-long class.

Students are expected to bring a **healthy snack** to class regularly, as well as their own **pencils, eraser, crayons & paper**.

After class, parents may meet their children at the library door or in the parking lot at **4 pm**. **Kindergarten** students may enroll in the second semester.

Depending on enrollment, classes will be offered as follows: **Mondays** beginning French, **Tuesdays** intermediate French, **Wednesdays** Spanish.
