<u>Vision</u>. Continue to provide the best Catholic education with electives and extra curricular activities, add a full day preschool, and grow endowment, alumni support and enrollment.

<u>Tuition</u> will increase by 4% next year. Fifth through eighth grade students will have an additional \$25 per month of tuition to support



We have a balanced budget of \$1.77M for next year. Teachers will get a 6.48% increase bringing them to 70% of what their counterparts made in the 19-20 year. The PK will have 2.5 FTE.
