

# HEALTH AND SAFETY UPDATE

- The safety of our students and staff is our highest priority. With our commitment to mask wearing, social distancing, frequent hand washing, sanitizing each room, morning screenings, ample ventilation in each room, and limiting access to essential staff on campus, we are doing our part to ensure that every child and teacher is in a safe place. Parents are also part of our success story when they keep their sick children home to recuperate fully. Working together, we can continue in-person instruction. To date, ICRS has zero cases.
