Wednesday Late Start. Every Wednesday, from 8:15-9:15am, teachers have the opportunity to work collaboratively to improve student learning. This is an opportune time for parents to set up medical appointments, music lessons, and other services for your child to minimize absences. Families who are dropping off K-8 students between 8:25-9:10am should use the St. Joe's parking lot and check their students in at the St. Joseph Center for a quiet study hall. Students can work on homework, read a book, color, draw. Students should bring their own material. The school will provide supervision. Students who arrive after 9:10 should stay in their cars in the ferry line. Children will be welcomed into their classrooms at 9:25am.

COVID Updates: Travel and Proof of Vaccination



ICRS follows the guidance of the governor, the local Dept of Health (DOH) and the Office of Catholic Schools (OCS) to provide a safe learning environment for students and staff and is committed to providing school in-person, five days a week. Guidance flexes with new information related to COVID. ICRS will continue a layered approach to support a safe learning environment. Below is current information on travel guidelines during COVID.

Travel guidelines are different for vaccinated and unvaccinated persons. The information below pertains to students and staff returning from travel. (doh.wa.gov 9/2/21; CDC, 9/9/21)

1.Unvaccinated: "Get tested 3-5 days after your trip and stay home and self-quarantine for a full 7 days after travel, even if your test is negative. If you don't get tested, stay home and self-quarantine for 10 days after travel."

Vaccinated persons: "Self-monitor for COVID-19 symptoms; isolate and get tested if you develop symptoms."

Proof of Vaccination. Mrs. Oropeza, the school secretary, is keeping record of those (students, staff, and parent volunteers) who show valid proof of COVID vaccination—either a COVID vaccination card or official medical vaccination records.

Frequently Asked Questions



Why do students have to wear masks at recess? At this time, while our COVID numbers are high and many students are unvaccinated, students wear masks at recess. Children like to play with one another at recess. Maintaining six feet between them while playing is not

realistic. Per the DOH, "Masks are strongly recommended for unvaccinated individuals when outdoors in crowded spaces or when in close contact with people from outside their household for a sustained period of time, as the risk of COVID-19 infection increases with the duration and closeness of contact between individuals."
