COVID UPDATES: Travel Quarantine Review



ICRS follows the guidance of the governor, the local Dept of Health (DOH) and the Office of Catholic Schools (OCS) to provide a safe learning environment for students and staff and is committed to providing school in-person, five days a week. Guidance flexes with new information related to COVID. ICRS will continue a layered approach to support a safe learning environment. Travel quarantines (CDC Travel Guidelines, Dec 10, 2021 update) are reviewed here.

All students traveling out of state this break will need to demonstrate a negative COVID test before returning to school on Jan 3. With a negative COVID test and the absence of COVID symptoms...

- 1. **Fully* vaccinated students** do <u>not</u> have to quarantine upon return from travel. (*Fully vaccinated means two weeks after the final dose of a vaccine.)
- Unvaccinated students will quarantine at least 7 days.

Students who travel out of state and *choose not to get tested* can return to school on Day 10 if they are symptom-free.

Parents, please inform the school if your child is traveling out of state this Christmas. ICRS will offer free testing on Monday, Jan 3 beginning at 9:30am. An online scheduler will be emailed to families before Jan 3.
