COVID UPDATES: Reporting Positive Cases of COVID



ICRS follows the guidance of the governor, the local Dept of Health (DOH) and the Office of Catholic Schools (OCS) to provide a safe learning environment for students and staff and is committed to providing school in-person, five days a week. Guidance flexes with new information related to COVID. ICRS will continue a layered approach to support a safe learning environment. Below is more guidance for reporting positive COVID cases to the school.

Showing Symptoms. Any student or staff who reports COVID-19-like symptoms must be immediately isolated from others and sent home and referred to diagnostic testing as soon as feasible, regardless of vaccination status. (WA DOH 1/7/22, p. 11) Parents can call the school to set up an appointment for a COVID test.

COVID Positive. If your child tests positive for COVID, parents must inform the school (<u>email the</u> <u>office</u>) and I have to report to the DOH. The DOH asks a series of questions to determine infectious dates and "freedom date" or the date a student can return to school. When a student has a confirmed case of COVID, parents, please fill out this <u>ICRS</u> <u>COVID questionnaire</u>. Your responses will remain private and confidential and inform next steps.

If there is a case of COVID in your household and isolating the person with COVID is not possible, please quarantine your students (vaccinated or not) at home as well. This new variant affects vaccinated and non-vaccinated persons. Students who have had a positive case of COVID in the past 90 days, verified by the DOH, do not have to quarantine.

Outbreak. Following the <u>WA DOH</u> definition of an "outbreak" within a classroom, ICRS will pivot to remote learning for five days for the single classroom. Testing will be offered on the morning of the return date. Students who test negative can return to in-person learning. Students who have had a positive case of COVID in the past 90 days, verified by the DOH, can return to in-person learning. Others will have to continue quarantining until Day 10.

We understand that these rules are complicated and detailed. Our intention is to balance safety and the need to be in school. Please contact Principal Rodrigues if you have any questions.

The best way to protect against COVID is to get vaccinated and to stay home if you are sick. The school policy is that a student has to be free of symptoms for 24 hours, without medication, prior to returning to school (assuming symptoms are not part of an ongoing medical condition).
