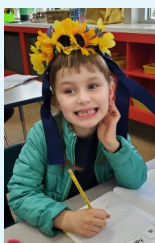

MORNING DROP OFF begins April 11.

It's been two years since ICRS families have dropped their children off at school (versus using a ferry line). We are reinstating the morning drop off routine beginning the Monday after spring break. Children will have 15 minutes to play before the bell rings at 8:30am.

How does it work? The gates will be locked so cars will have to line up along the fence. At 8:15, when a duty is present, students in the first four cars unload on the passenger side. Students walk along the fence to the pedestrian gate. Those cars leave, the next four cars pull up, etc. Parents can also drop students off at St. Joseph Center when a duty is present at 8:15. Students who show up before then will be sent to Ext. Care (fees incurred).



Important traffic safety concerns. Parents should drive south on 15th to enter the St. Joseph or main parking lots. This traffic flow avoids a backup at the intersection. Drive slowly. Be mindful of pedestrians in the parking lot. Pedestrians have the right of way.

COVID UPDATES: Morning Drop Off Resumes April 11



ICRS follows the guidance of the governor, the local [Dept of Health \(DOH\)](#) and the Office of Catholic Schools (OCS) to provide a safe learning environment for students and staff and is committed to providing school in-person, five days a week. Guidance flexes with new information related to COVID. ICRS will continue a layered approach to support a safe learning environment and will peel back each layer as DOH guidance allows. ICRS Plan for a soft roll out to lift other mitigation measures in April:

4/11, Reinstate morning drop off and before school recess

4/15, Whole school prayer service, Stations of the Cross at Church, 1:45

4/29, Whole school Mass, 9:30am

The best way to protect against COVID is to get vaccinated and to stay home if you are sick. The school policy is that a student has to be free of symptoms for 24 hours, without medication, prior to returning to school (assuming symptoms are not part of an ongoing medical condition).
