COVID UPDATES: Key Methods of Risk Reduction



ICRS follows the guidance of the governor, the local Dept-of-Health (DOH) and the Office of Catholic Schools (OCS) to provide a safe learning environment for students and staff and is committed to providing school in-person, five days a week. Guidance flexes with new information related to COVID. Below is a reminder of ways to reduce COVID spread.

Key methods of risk reduction (source: DOH email 4/29/22):

- Good ventilation is critical to reducing risk in indoor spaces.
- Get vaccinated, get boosted.
- Wear a well-fitting mask indoors in crowded spaces if you are high risk or want to protect yourself and those around you from exposure.
- Stay home if you have any symptoms. Stay home for at least 5 days if you test positive for COVID or 10 days if symptoms do not resolve or you do not test negative at day 5.
- Get tested, either with a home test or a provider test. It is a good idea to repeat the test 24 to 48 hours later if your initial test is negative and you still have symptoms.

Consult your healthcare provider if you test positive to see if oral anti-viral therapy is recommended for you. Therapy must be started within 5 days of symptom onset or a positive test if asymptomatic.

"While we are moving into a new phase of the pandemic, COVID-19 remains with us, and it should be recognized the COVID-19 pandemic response must remain flexible with the possibility for changes that occur at the state and local levels. Conditions may require implementation of additional mitigation practices to lessen the impact of disease in schools and provider settings, and to ensure continuity of in -person instruction and care." (DOH, 3/10/22, p.6)
