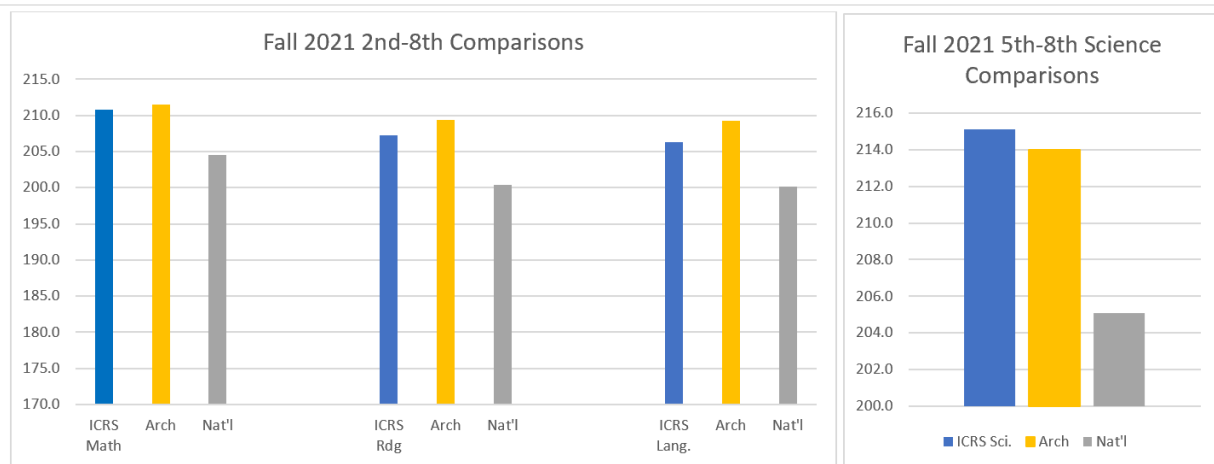
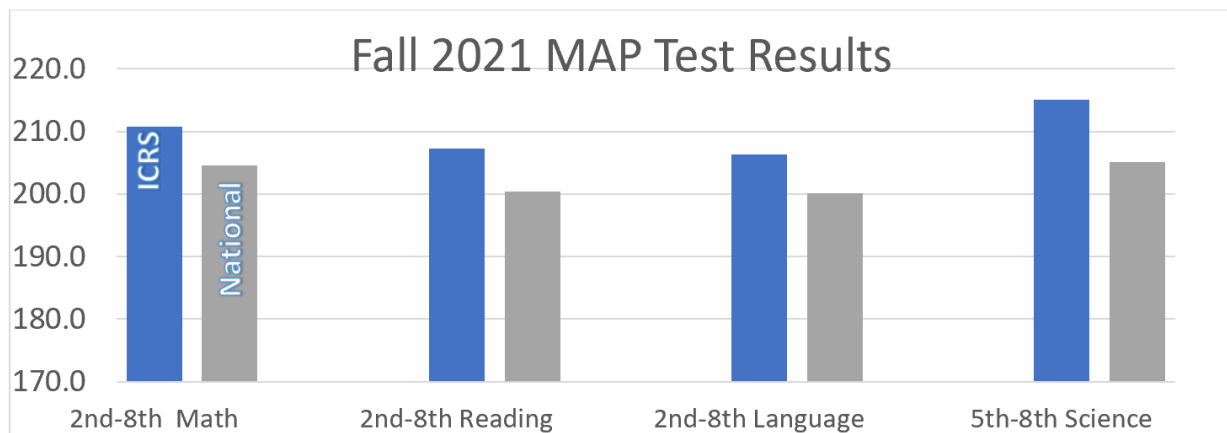


# ICRS MAP Test Results: Fall 2021

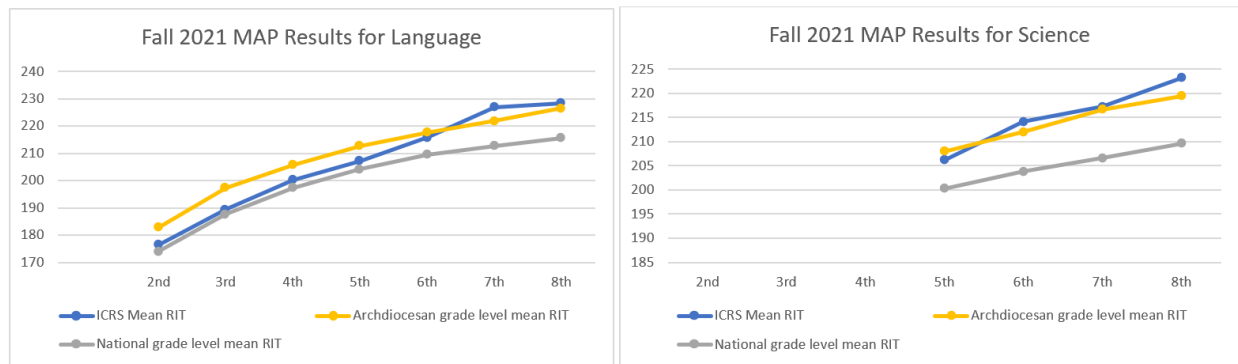
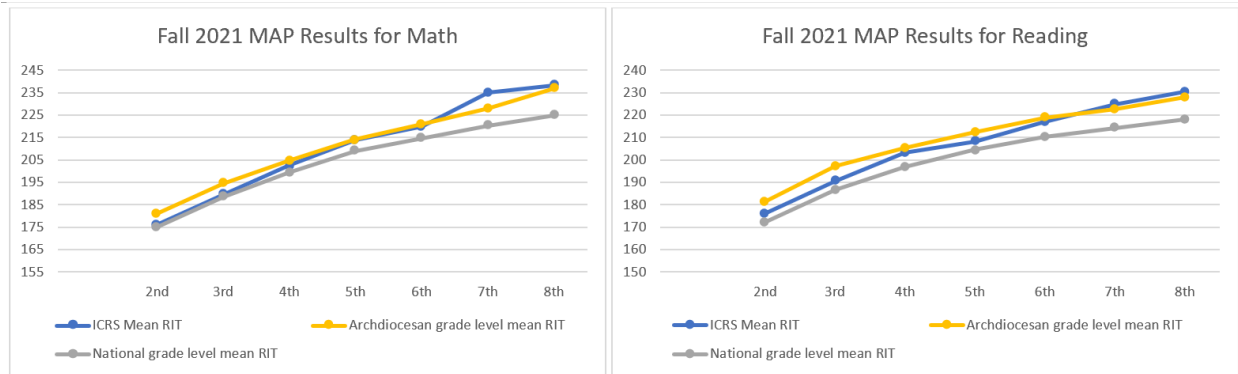
In the Fall of 2021, ICRS 2nd-8th grade students took the Measurement of Academic Progress (MAP) test. The MAP test is an on-line adaptive test and determines students' instructional readiness and academic goals, based on RIT (short for Rasch unit) scores. The students will take the test again in the spring to showcase academic growth over the school year. The data below shows how ICRS students perform compared to students both nationwide and within the Archdiocese. ICRS students are within 3 RIT points of the Archdiocese in math, reading and language. In science, ICRS 5th-8th grade students are a point ahead of the Archdiocesan mean.



Compared to peers nationally, ICRS students perform 6-10 RIT points ahead in all subjects.



The data below shows how each class compares to their peers in the Archdiocese and across the nation. ICRS students entering our program in the lower grades perform slightly above their national peers and below Archdiocesan peers. As students progress through the grades at ICRS, their academic performance improves. By middle school ICRS students perform at or above their Archdiocesan peers.



At ICRS, we are proud of our students and the work/ministry of our teachers. Their dedication to teaching the children is most certainly reflected in student test scores.
