


PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

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COVID UPDATES

As we start a new school year, we have new guidance for the way we handle COVID. The Archdiocese follows the Department of Health, and ICRS follows the Archdiocese. Below are the highlighted changes from last school year:

- Vaccine mandate is still in effect for employees, volunteers, & contractors, with the exception of outdoor activities (unvaccinated volunteers may do recess duty and other outdoor activities but must test prior to volunteering. Tests can be taken at home or administered at school.)
- no social distancing requirement
- updated return to school protocols after testing positive (Day 0 is first day of symptoms or day of positive test if asymptomatic)
- 1. May return after 5 full days of isolation IF asymptomatic or symptoms improve AND no fever for 24 hours without medication
- 2. Those testing positive with antigen or at-home tests towards end of full 5-day isolation, and/or on days 6-10, are required to complete the full 10 day isolation
- 3. Should continue to mask for additional 5 days if return at end of 5-day period
