

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents,

I'd like to share a **message from Father Tom** with you:

Blessed Holy Week and Easter to you and to our whole Immaculate Conception Regional School family! As you know spring break coincides with Holy Week and I invite you to make the upcoming celebrations of our Christian faith a priority. The procession with palms on Palm Sunday, the washing of feet on Holy Thursday, the darkness and adoration of the Holy Cross on Good Friday, and the music and flowers—and, of course, the parish Easter egg hunts—of Easter Sunday, all make a deep impression on our children and on us. We hope you will join us!

It is always a joy for Fr. Paul, Fr. Temo and me to celebrate school Masses and to visit classes at ICRS. I always come away impressed and encouraged from time with students, teachers, and staff. I have appointed SVCC members Dan Fisher (chair), Kathy Cartee, Pauline Cline, Sue Christianson, and Antonio Velasco to serve on the ICRS Principal Search Committee as we follow the Archdiocesan process to transition from an interim to a permanent principal. This process includes surveys of ICRS teachers/staff and school families that will be sent soon. The position will be posted and after evaluating and interviewing applicants the ICRS Principal Search Committee will make a recommendation. We are pleased that interim principal Sarah Rutherford will be a candidate for the permanent position.

PROJECT BASED LEARNING UPDATES

We have lots of project-based learning happening at ICRS. The 6th graders had visitors from the Bread Lab as part of their year-long study of bread. They learned about the thousands of varieties of grain that the Bread Lab plants, observes, and develops.

The 7th and 8th graders learned about homelessness in preparation for their field trip next month to Martha's Place, Catholic Community Services' new permanent supportive housing project. The 7th and 8th graders will be assembling furniture at Martha's place next month as part of an ongoing service project. We strive to educate students about the complex factors that cause such issues as homelessness, and to teach children to respond from the lens of Catholic social teaching.

Mrs. Morrison took the 5th grade class on a wonderful outdoor education overnight trip to Camp Killoqua and Mrs. Santucci took the 3rd grade class on an "About Town" field trip to learn about their community. They visited the police department, the fire station, the library, and Hillcrest Park.
