Dear Parents,

Volunteering

We require volunteer hours at ICRS. This enables us to provide excellent programs and keeps costs down. Remember, the cost to educate a student at ICRS is about \$9,200, while the average cost to educate a student in Skagit County is \$17,000.

Volunteering also provides great benefits for parents: you see your child in action and can monitor their academic, social, and emotional growth in a school setting; you are able to connect with other parents as you work to complete a project; you get to know teachers and staff more intimately; and you are able to build a community where your family belongs. As one parent said in our recent survey: "Initially, I was wary about the parent volunteer requirement, but I now see how much this "requirement" fosters a deep sense of community, cultivates meaningful relationships, and creates a very special "ICRS culture."

Some important volunteer opportunities for next year include Yearbook Coordinator, Volunteer Coordinator, and Booster Co-Chair.

Staffing

I am grateful and excited to announce our preschool staff for next year. Rachel Youngquist and Jamie Eskola will co-teach. They are excited to collaborate to create a nurturing and structured environment for our little ones. Dolores Garcia will be the full-time aide. She will take the lead in teaching Spanish in the preschool.

Linda Morrison will teach Spanish to grades K-5 once a week and will continue teaching middle school Spanish elective. The goal for next year is to have several 8th graders take the Spanish test at MVHS for high school credit.

MAP test scores come home today in the Brown Envelope. We acknowledge that this test is one measure of student progress on one day. Students can have a bad testing day! However, if your child's teacher is concerned about test scores, they will be contacting you.

Hot Lunch

In last week's parent survey, there were lots of questions about the increase in price for hot lunch, so I am going to try to answer your questions.

- 1. We contract with MVSD to get our hot lunch. We do not have choice regarding the menu.
- 2. MVSD is raising our price (with milk) to over \$4 per lunch for next year. We also have to pay staff to administer and serve the lunches, so the price next year will be \$4.50. (We actually lose money on each lunch.)
- 3. The reason we don't have free lunch for everyone is there is a state policy that allows free lunch for schools that meet a threshold of students who qualify for free and reduced lunch. We do not have that many students who qualify.
- 4. We will still offer free and reduced lunch to families who qualify. Please make sure that you complete the forms when they come home this summer.
- 5. The School Commission and Finance Council will be exploring alternatives to our hot lunch program next year. If you would like to be on a hot lunch exploratory committee, please contact me.
