## WAIT UNTIL 8TH SMARTPHONE PLEDGE

Dear ICRS Parents,

At Back to School Night and in a recent Principal's Newsletter I mentioned the "Wait Until 8th" pledge, a commitment that a group of parents can make together not to give their children a smartphone until at least 8th grade. I wanted to circle back with you to provide more information and encourage you to consider taking the pledge today.

We're all aware that smartphones are distracting and potentially dangerous for children, and that the negative impact of too much screen time, and especially the wrong kind of screen time, is hitting our kids hard. Playing outdoors, spending time with friends, reading books, and hanging out with family is happening a lot less to make room for unchaperoned social media and internet surfing, addictive apps, and binge watching YouTube.

The problem is that these devices are in widespread use in elementary and middle school because of unrealistic social pressure and expectations to have one. Parents often feel powerless in this uphill battle and need community support to help delay the presence of the smartphone in the classroom, socializing, and the family dinner table.

The Wait Until 8th pledge empowers parents to rally together to delay giving children a smartphone until at least 8th grade. **By banding together, this will decrease the pressure felt by kids and parents alike to get a smartphone.**

## WAIT UNTIL 8TH (Cont.)

Please note that the pledge is for smartphones only! If you would like your child to have a basic phone that just calls and texts, you can still sign the pledge. A basic phone avoids many of the dangers and distractions of the smartphone, and <u>the Wait Until 8th website</u> reviews several basic phones here.

A pledge becomes "active" once 10 or more families from a grade at a school sign up. This takes away the fear of being the only parent in the class that signs the pledge, because it only kicks in once at least 10 families sign from your grade. <u>Signing the pledge</u> only takes a couple minutes and is very easy.

I recognize that every family's situation is different, and that taking the pledge may not be for everyone. ICRS is also committed to ensuring that our students have a rigorous education in the responsible use of technology, so that they can use it to advance and expand their opportunities, not have them limited by it. This isn't an anti-technology issue. It's about being intentional about when, how, and where we introduce technology into our kids' lives.

Thank you for considering this way that we can let our kids be kids a little longer!
