As part of our ongoing safety initiative, we have monthly drills to ensure students are prepared in the event of an emergency. This month we will have a **lockdown drill** on **January 18th at 10:45 a.m**. Teachers tell students specifics about what to do in case of an emergency, and frequent drills help us practice our response in a variety of scenarios. Despite our best efforts, some children become anxious regarding drills; I am communicating now so that you will have an opportunity to talk with your child.

We are grateful to Janette Strand for working with our Altar Servers Club. We now have about 30 ICRS students who have been trained to serve at Masses. If your child has been trained at ICRS, I encourage you to contact your home parish to get your child on the altar server schedule. Children may need to do additional training at their home parishes so that they can be ready for the specifics in that church. We are excited and grateful to share our Catholic faith in this way.
