

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Dear Parents:

This week, you will notice a new look to ICRS report cards. We strive to create our report cards that are informative records of student progress. One thing you will notice is the new



set of boxes that the indicate levels of support that students at ICRS receive. I want to take a minute to explain special services at ICRS.

First, our goal is to meet each child's individual needs. Teachers call this differentiation or Response to Intervention Rtl.

Teachers make accommodations and modifications based on children's cognitive and emotional needs. Some children get challenge work, while others get extra help or shortened assignments. We are blessed to have Mr. Hollick, Mrs. Whitaker, Mrs. Cardenas, Ms. Morgan, Mrs. Espinoza, and Mrs. Keck who support students in and outside of class. In addition, students in 4th-8th grades may be asked to go to Homework Help after school. This is based on teacher recommendations. We also have students who get reading support from Mrs. Keck and Mrs. Espinoza after school.

An ISP is the private school equivalent of an IEP (Individualized Learning Plan) for a child who qualifies for special education services. This is a legally binding document that we create with the help of the Mount Vernon School District. ICRS currently has seven students with ISPs. A 504 Plan is sometimes appropriate for a student who does not qualify for an ISP/IEP, but has special learning needs. ICRS carefully monitors students based on MAP scores, classroom assessments, and teacher observations. We update our Response to Intervention Rtl spreadsheet monthly at PLC meetings on Wednesday mornings. Teachers collaborate to determine the best way to respond to each child's needs. This might include shortening assignments, preferential seating, giving more time for tests, or

adjusting the reading level of texts.

On this report card, most parents will see NO marked in the special needs boxes. If you see YES, this should not be a surprise to you. But, as always, please contact your teacher if you have questions.
